In most parts of developed or newly industrialized nations, we have moved way beyond it. ## Of the Heart and Mind

#### Be Aware

Amidst the whirlwinds of economic downturn, where people are losing jobs left and right, a peculiar AGM gripped the news in Singapore for a few weeks of a rarely noticed organization called AWARE (Association of Women for Action and Research). At this AGM, a surprise challenge from a new team stood for election and won from the former committee and took over leadership of this not-for-profit organization. It went into the media and quickly became a media frenzy. Old quards, new quards exchanged discourses in the papers almost daily.

What was at stake was essentially a sex education program that quietly promoted homosexuality as normal, contrary to mainstream sentiments of multi-cultural and multi-religious Singapore.

Christians are sometimes divided as to what could or needs to be done. It perhaps mirrors the movie 'Mission'. where two Jesuit priests, in wanting to protect a village of converts while the Portuguese army approaches to enslave the villagers and sell them off. One. who has disavowed violence chooses not to do anything but prayed while the other took up arms to defend. Both were killed in the onslaught of the Portuquese. (Insight from an e-mail exchange of a brother). His

question was: "If you are the priest, whom do you want to play? The one who prays or the one who takes up arms?"

"To understand reality is not the same as to know about outward events. It is to perceive the essential nature of things. The best-informed man is not necessarily the wisest. Indeed there is a danger that precisely in the multiplicity of his knowledge he will lose sight of what is essential. But on the other hand, knowledge of an apparently trivial detail quite often makes it possible to see into the depth of things. And so the wise man will seek to acquire the best possible knowledge about events, but always without becoming dependent upon this knowledge." Dietrich Bonhoeffer.

Bonhoeffer was a pastor who was executed for involvement to over throw Hitler in 1945.

The 'Aware Saga' as some calls it, has brought to light some of the under-currents that existed in Singapore society, the interest or non-interest of various communities. What are we to make of these?

The Qohelet in Ecclesiastes speaks of times:

ECC 3:1 There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under heaven:

ECC 3:2 a time to be born and a time to die, a time to plant and a time to uproot,

ECC 3:3 a time to kill and a time to heal, a time to tear down and a time to build,

ECC 3:4 a time to weep and a time to laugh, a time to

mourn and a time to dance, ECC 3:5 a time to scatter stones and a time to gather them, a time to embrace and a time to refrain, ECC 3:6 a time to search and a time to give up, a time to keep and a time to throw away, ECC 3:7 a time to tear and a time to mend, a time to be silent and a time to speak, ECC 3:8 a time to love and a time to hate, a time for war and a time for peace.

It was English philosopher Edmund Burke who said, "All that is necessary for the triumph of evil is that good men do nothing." Idleness is not one of the attributes for activity. Even at times to be silent and refrain, there is to be conscious assessment of the times and seasons. It is however, unfortunate that many Christians are both ill informed and apathetic. More than that, our faith has not informed us of the culture in which we lived in and our spirituality has not been engaged in how we live out in our earthly activities.

BE AWARE !!! We are in the midst of a fierce spiritual battle (Eph 6:12), fleshed out in the arenas of daily life, for the bodies, hearts and minds of persons in need of Jesus the Savior. Whether we like it or not, we are in the thick of it. In a 'Flat World' described by Thomas Friedman, we are back in the wild wild west, all is fair game.

The ultimate test of a moral society is the kind of world that it leaves to its children." Dietrich Bonhoeffer. May God gives us wisdom and strength to do what is right and good.

## The Day the Earth Stood Still

I took note more of earth day today, partially because of the 1 hour blackout and this movie. The movie is a loose remake of a 1951 movie of the same name. In the movie. Keanu Reeves is an alien named Klaatu who is on a mission to save the earth from the destructive lifestyle of the human race. He met with Dr. Helen Benson (Jennifer Connelly) who is encouraging him to do so. I don't particularly fancy Reeve's and Connelly's acting but I am intrigued by some of the conversations and reflects the worldview of Hollywood. Klaatu: I can't risk the survival of this planet for the sake of one species. If the earth dies, you die. If you die the earth survives.

Now that is an interesting and utilitarian perspective from an alien, perhaps a Darwinist? If there is no God and humans are but pests to the other species, it makes sense. But the irony is that there is no real compelling reason. Even for humanist to justify why we should allow humans to continue existing while destroying the earth and other living organisms.

The justification from another alien in the movie who lived among humans for 70 years just



simply said that despite humans self destructiveness, this is now his home and opts to die with the human race.

Klaatu seeing the reconciliation of Helen and her step son just said, "There's another side to you. I feel it now". In all the justifications garnered by humanists for the non-existence of God, and post-modern relativists who could not justify even their own relative view points, 'Feelings' becomes the only measurement and yardstick.

Christians however, have both a rational and reason. For God so loved the world (the cosmos, the created order), that He gave his one and only begotten son...(John 3:16).

Environmentalists argues that to save the earth, many have opted to turn back the clock. In a plea to change Klaatu's mind:
Helen: We can change, we can still turn things around.
Klaatu: We watched, we waited and hoped that you would. It's reached the tipping point. We have to act. We'll undo the damage you've done and give the Earth a chance to begin again.

Here again lies a big difference between the humanist and the Christian. The humanist has no bearing or hope because their theology is also primarily existential (living for the here and now). For the Christians, we look forward to the new heaven and the new earth. It is not only where all creation will be redeemed, but that technology (it



will no longer be a garden but a city remember?) will be perfected and harmonized with the new regenerated order (Rev 21 & 22).

Finally giving in
Klaatu: It comes to you at a price,
to you and your way of life.
Helen: But we could change, just
give us a chance.

Hollywood continues to live in fantasy land? We could change just on our own? Let see...the Fall...Noah and the ark...and we still need the Cross. What is missing is truly the appreciation of original sin. That which not only affected our relationship with God and with each other, but also with our relationship with the environment in which we live in. Thorns and thistles grew after the pronouncement of judgment after the Fall (Genesis 3).
